

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Autism?

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a neurological and developmental disability that impacts social, communication, and behavioral development. Each individual diagnosed with ASD has a unique set of strengths and weaknesses but typically struggle with some degree of social deficits, restricted interests, and repetitive behavior.

What are common characteristics of Autism?

Social Communication Deficits

- Limited social responding
- Poor eye contact when others are speaking
- Lack of interest in social interactions or social play
- Avoidance of physical contact (e.g., tickles, cuddles, etc.)
- Difficulty with perspective taking and emotional understanding

Restricted Interests

- Lack of interest in peers
- Deficits in functional play skills
- Unusual or perseverative interests
- Strict adherence to routines

Repetitive Behavior

- Obsessing over certain patterns or arranging things a certain way
- Patterns of repetitive motor behavior
- Echolalia or scripting

Common signs

Motor & speech delays

Sensory aversions

Scripted speech

Food selectivity

Difficulty accepting change

Trouble with abstract concepts

Challenges acquiring new skills

What treatments are available?

Although there is no "cure" for autism, there are several different treatment options that may benefit your child, including:

- Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA Therapy)
- Speech Therapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Physical Therapy
- Special Education
- Behavioral Health
- Social Skills Training
- Medication management

What is ABA?

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) utilizes the principles of learning and behavior to increase skills to improve an individual's quality of life. By uniting parents, caregivers, and individuals, ABA therapy utilizes the functions of behavior, data, and reinforcement to systematically teach a variety of skills. With over 30 years of scientific data to support it, ABA is the only evidence-based practice endorsed by the Surgeon General for the treatment of autism.



Questions to ask your ABA Provider

VALUES & APPROACH

- What are the values of the organization and how are they exemplified?
- Does the organization value dignity and autonomy in their clinical approach?
- Does the organization support and appreciate nuerodiversity?

STAFFING

- How many RBTs will be working with my child in a given week?
- What happens with our appointment if my child's trained RBTs are out?
- How often will I be able to see my child's supervisor?
- What is your staff turnover like?
- How experienced is your staff?

SAFETY

- How do you manage challenging behavior?
- Will I be notified in a timely manner if there is a safety issue or incident with my child?
- What measures are in place to prevent safety issues and abuse?



Questions to ask your ABA Provider (cont.)

INVOLVEMENT

- How often can I be part of sessions or observe my child?
- How much training to caregivers receive?
- How often will I be able to see and discuss with my child's supervisor?
- If I don't like the procedure or way a goal is being worked on, how do I address these issues?

GOALS

- How are goals identified and assessed?
- How often do caregivers receive updates on progress?
- How do you ensure generalization across people and environments?
- What happens if my child is not making progress on their goals?
- How often do you assess for new goals?
- What is your supervisor's success rate with completion of goals/outcomes?

DISCHARGE

- How do you decide when it is clinically appropriate for a child to discharge from services?
- What information do you provide in a Discharge Report?
- Do you provide recommendations for next steps or different types of appropriate services?







ACCESSNebraska

 Therapy center offering a full continuum of comprehensive care, programs and services for special populations.

Milo's Connection

 Library of resources, services, and events in the Nebraska and lowa region.

• Project Harmony

 Child advocacy group working to collaborate with professionals and engage the community to end child abuse and neglect.

• Project Lifesaver

 Community based, public safety organization that provides law enforcement, fire/rescue, and caregivers with a program designed to protect, and when necessary, quickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering.

PTI Nebraska

 Statewide organization that provides training, information and support to Nebraska parents and professionals who have an interest in children who receive or should receive special education or special health related services.

Boystown Autism Clinic
